Personal Development: A Guide for Parents/Carers

What is Personal Development?

Personal Development sits at the heart of the curriculum at Fernwood School, with importance placed upon dedicated weekly lessons delivered by a team of Personal Development teachers. Other schools may call this PSHE. We focus on nurturing our young people to show empathy to others, be a reflective learner, and to become a critical thinker.

What will my child learn in these lessons?

Their lessons act as a strong guiding vessel for delivering the schools' curriculum aims; to develop successful learners, responsible citizens, and confident individuals. In Personal Development lessons, pupils are likely to take part in discussions, hear from guest speakers, explore lots of scenarios, role play, challenge misconceptions and encounter lots of new information.

Unit 1: Building for the Future

This unit covers:

- How to write a CV and what makes it stand out to a future employer
- Digital footprints and why this is an important part of employability
- Interview skills

This unit coincides with the Careers Convention on Thursday 12th October.

Discussion points/questions for home:

- Does your child know what they would like to do when they leave Fernwood? There are lots of options for young people now beyond traditional a-levels which may be more appropriate for your child.
- Has your child looked at any post-16 providers? You may wish to look at the open evening dates for colleges and sixth forms together.
- If your child uses social media, what are their privacy settings? Do they understand the potential future impact of their digital footprint?
